STEM at Blackbutt SS - Yesterday the senior class had our first visit to Blackbutt State School to undertake the STEM learning as organised by the University of the Sunshine Coast (USC). Years 3 & 4 are learning about the environment, in particular the effect some animals have on the eucalyptus trees. They will be making a game in a program call Scratch and have already started the planning stage. Year 5 students are learning about drones while the Year 6 students are delving into light and how it works. We leave school at 10.40 a.m. and travel to Blackbutt on the Out There Cycling Bus with the students from Harlin. We have lunch at 1.15 p.m. then head back to school.

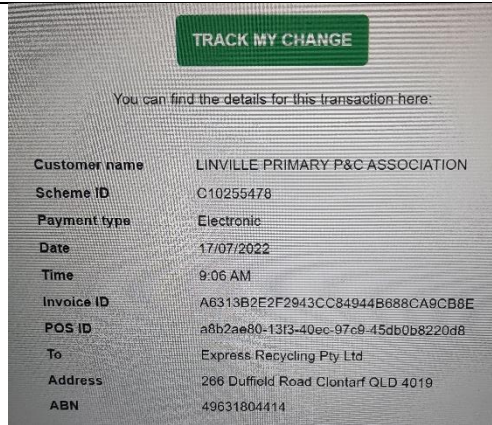

Prep-Year 2 Class

This term we will be involved in a lot of fun and engaging experiences across all areas of learning.

In our current Science unit, we are investigating light and sound. Students will conduct investigations by responding to and posing questions, making predictions, manipulating materials and collecting and sorting information, just as scientists do. We encourage you to investigate and discuss experiences of light and sound with your child.

In Art this term students will create new stories in artworks by collaging characters, objects and landscapes from different sources. They will use their imagination and creativity to explore each other’s ideas and aspects of their own lives, to decide on how best to represent their personalities and interests.

Our English unit involves analysing and creating informative multimodal texts. The students will be looking at and discussing information about flying foxes and how we can live with them.

In Maths we will be focussing on various concepts regarding measurement, shapes and chance and data. There is a lot of opportunity for hands on, fun activities that will re-enforce their learning of these topics.

In HASS (Humanities and Social Sciences) the Prep students will explore special familiar places and how to care for them. Years 1 and 2 students will investigate connections to places at different scales. This will entail lots of map making and discussion on places far and wide. We will also be making a three dimensional model of our region.

HPE (Health and Physical Education) will focus on healthy choices and getting along with others. The students will also be involved in regular active learning experiences and fundamental movement practice. Many outdoor games involve sharing, turn taking and fair play, so there will be many opportunities for fun while we learn.
